The Learning Goals

Units of Work

The units of work are where learning happens. More than 70 different and exciting thematic unit of work have been developed for children aged 6-7 (Milepost 1), 8-9 (Milepost 2) and 10-12 (Milepost 3) with more in the pipeline. Each unit of work provides teachers with everything they need to plan exciting learning experiences for their children and help children achieve great learning. Included are units such as:

There are even special units that help children learn about their own learning.

Assessment

Each unit of work provides advice to teachers on how to assess what children have learned whilst engaged in their work. Even more helpful, the IPC Assessment for Learning Programme provides everything you need to identify the stages of children's skill development in eight subjects of the curriculum and international-mindedness at each of three stages - for children aged 6-7, 8-9 and 10-12.
